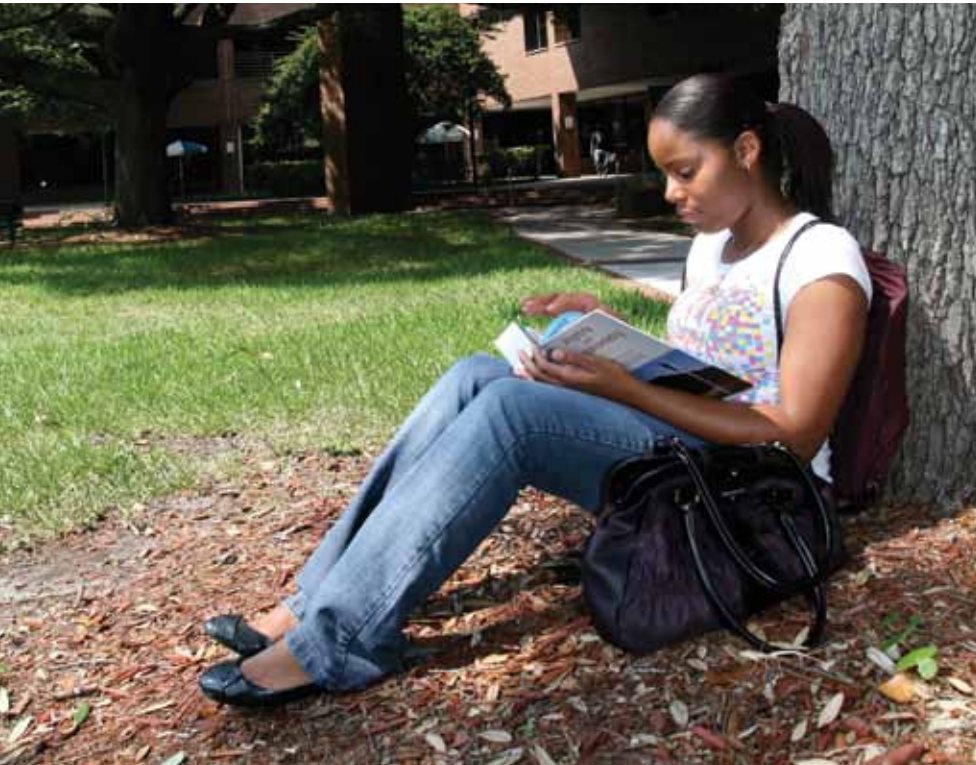

Crystal Cooper

Crystal Cooper was raised in a household bubbling with musical influence and talent. Whether waking up to the sounds of her father's saxophone or relaxing to an old Ella Fitzgerald record, she was never far from music's warm embrace. She began singing in church at a very early age and by the end of high school had mastered the guitar and written several original songs. Her music draws influence from a very broad spectrum: everything from jazz icon Billie Holiday to R&B/soul powerhouse Natalie Cole.
