Financial Skills Academy

(FSA) currently consists of two certification courses: FSA 0101, Basic Financial Skills, and FSA 0201, Investing. Each free course is four weeks long, and FSA 0101 is not a prerequisite to be able to enroll in FSA 0201. The courses are hybrid, involving face to face and online interaction via Blackboard. Live sessions are taped so students who are not able to attend the face to face sessions can still watch them from the Blackboard site. Participation in the FSA is free and open to all FSCJ students and employees. Participants that answer 75% of the 20 questions correctly on the final exam of each course will receive a certificate of completion. Check the calendar for listings.

The Path to a Healthier Relationship

Jereme Ford has faced his challenges. Raised in poverty in central Florida, he's been bullied, he failed high school twice, he joined a gang, he faced death twice, he's lost family and friends, and he's even lost a child to abortion. Rather than dwell on the negative, Jereme saw an opportunity for self-reflection and growth. His experiences made him exceptionally adept at understanding how to help others make it through their own personal storms. But it's not what Jereme has been through that makes his story one of such inspiration; it's what he has gained from it. Taking this passion and turning it into a degree in Sociology and Woman's Studies from the University of Central Florida, Jereme focuses on developing introspective and positive patterns of thinking prior to investing in a relationship with another, affording you the tools to place yourself in a position wherein emotional bankruptcy is far from a possibility. His presentation shares an overall message of self-love and its importance for each individual. He'll discuss self-examination, relationship assessment, honesty and goodness to one's self, and the greatness that each of us comes equipped with as well as how to find and employ it. As he says, "Smart is learning from our mistakes; wisdom is learning from those of others."
