# MONEY MANAGEMENT 101: HOW TO DEVELOP A BUDGET 

You got paid Friday and by Monday your pockets are as empty as the icebox. Unlike the peanut butter you'll wolf down for four weeks, your money doesn't stick to the roof of anything. You need a budget, but where to start?

The first thing to do is relax. A budget isn't a straightjacket. It's simply a way to live within your income and still save for luxuries up the road. Once you understand that, you need to sit down and figure out what your total income is and what your expenses are. Mary Quinn, director of the National Foundation for Consumer Credit, suggests drawing a 12 -column grid (one column for each month) and listing types of expenses down the side such as rent, car payments, or insurance. For each expense, put a dot in the month when a payment is due. For example, if you have a car payment each month, put a dot in every column next to car payment. The grid will tell you at a glance what your overall yearly expenses look like.

Once you have an overview, figure out what your fixed and variable costs are each month. You already know fixed costs like rent, car payments, or insurance, but pinpointing variable costs like food, clothing, and entertainment can be tougher. Jennifer Weir, financial planner for the Asset Planning Corporation in Knoxville, Tennessee, recommends recording every penny you
spend for at least two months. Once you see where your money is going, you'll be able to set reasonable monthly limits for each type of expense. Says Weir, "After you've done this for several months, you internalize it. It's like learning to drive a four-speed. It starts out feeling uncomfortable but gradually becomes an unconscious action."
Now that you know where your money

has been going, you can decide where you'd rather have it go. One recommended goal is to build at least two months' salary in savings. That will protect you against sudden costs like an asthmatic muffler or a visiting friend who loves to eat out. Weir suggests setting a specific timetable for this goal or any other. "If you just say, 'someday,' that gives you no way to assess if you're progressing, and you won't get there. Once you know how much you need, divide the amount by the number of months you've allowed yourself, and then you gan determine how much to save per month."

No one says budgeting is easy, but it does have its own rewards such as peace of mind and a sense of control. Budgeting can also save you from debt, a plight of many new graduates suddenly faced with car payments, an unfurnished apartment, and a psyche attuned to parental comforts. One particularly hazardous trap is buying on credit. Emphasizing that credit payments should total no more than 20 percent of your take-home pay, Quinn adds, "If your friends look better off than you do, don't assume they're not up to their ears in debt-they probably are."

## GETTING MARRIED: LEARNING THE ART OF COMPROMISE

"You like tomato and I like tomahto. Potato, potahto, tomato, tomahto. Let's call the whole thing off."
from "Let's Call the Whole Thing Off" by Ira and George Gershwin, 1937.

Lyrics like that don't make a bit of sense until you get married. You can live with the fact he's not a doctor; it's the toenail clippings on the floor that may end the marriage. Yet lots of people are getting married and loving it.
For one thing, it's fun-like one long sleep-over without mom yelling, "Go to
sleep!" Here's someone who won't blab your secrets, for whom your wildest dreams-like houseboating down the Mississippi or prairie-hopping in a covered wagon-seem real.

Still, initial adjustments can be tough. Suddenly, when you eat and sleep, how you dress, and what you do are all shared by another person who does those things differently. If your stomach growls at 7 p.m. and he's cooking, you still may not eat until 10. Explains Dr. Jarle Brors, founder and director of the National Institute of Marriage and Family Relations in Springfield, Virginia, "The greatest adjustment is with each other. Be honest with each other about the time you need to be alone or asleep, and then you will find time together."
