    1. Find the day and period your class normally meets.
    2. Find the exam time (to the right) that corresponds with your class period.
    3. Applied music exams are to be arranged by the instructor
    4. Conflicts will be rescheduled by the dean of Student Affairs.
    5. Exams are to be held in the classroom where the class normally meets.
    6. Any student who is scheduled for four examinations in one day may reschedule one of the four examinations. A student may initiate the request through the dean of Student Affairs on the campus. Under no circumstances will a student be permitted to reschedule consecutive examinations on two campuses unless the student has four examinations scheduled that day. No examination is to be rescheduled without permission from the Student Affairs dean. The Student Affairs dean will notify the instructor concerned if an examination is to be rescheduled.
