## Clean-Air Countdown!

Effective March 1, 2013, Florida State College at Jacksonville will be a tobacco and smoke free organization. Accordingly, Florida State College will prohibit the use, distribution or sale of all tobacco products in all indoor and exterior college-owned property, all institution-sponsored off-campus events, and in all campus-owned vehicles. College employees, students, visitors, contractors, and all others are expected to comply with this rule and the Florida Indoor Clean Air Act at all times. On the last Monday of every month, we will mark the days left until the tobacco ban takes effect.
