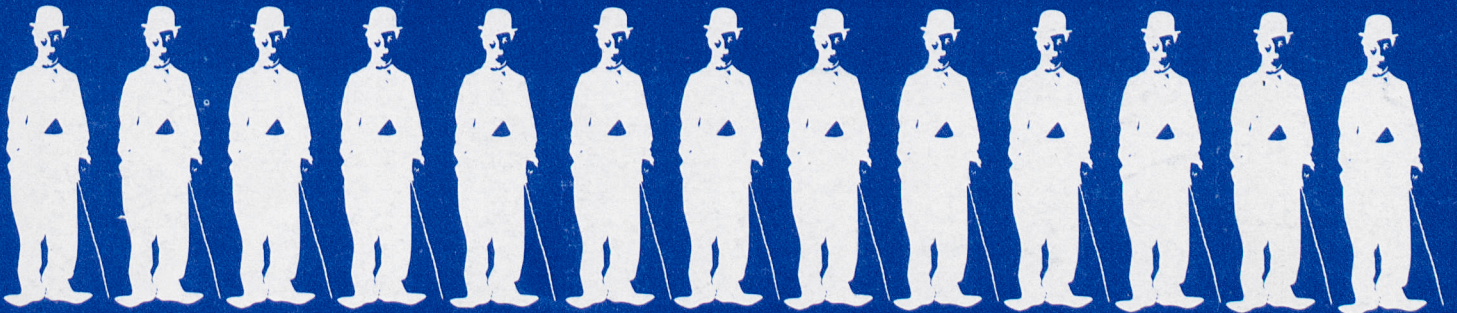

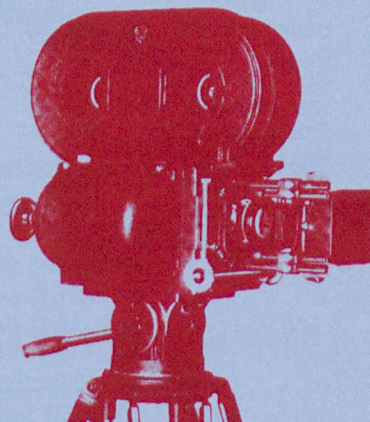

### Sept. 13

**DIVA** — 1982 — 123 mins. — Jean-Jacques Beiniex (French). The film is a breathtaking array of visual images in a romantic thriller about an opera-intoxicated 18-year-old mail carrier who becomes unwittingly entangled in a web of murder, intrigue, and passion. Flamboyant fun and hailed as one of the finest French films in recent years.

### Sept. 20

**THE AMERICAN FRIEND** — 1977 — 127 mins. — Wim Wenders (English & German). This international thriller



established Wenders as a major director. The complex plot concerns a German artisan employed as an assassin by a French gangster through the manipulations of a mysterious American, superbly played by Dennis Hopper.

**Sept. 27**

**THE WANDERERS** — 1979 — 113 mins. — Philip Kaufman. Karen Allen and Ken Wahl star in this finely drawn, at times hilarious, portrait of street life in the Bronx in 1963. This shrewd, funny, sometimes surreal comedy-drama beautifully captures that twilight period in our culture.

**Oct. 4**

**XICA DA SILVA** — 1982 — 120 mins. — Carlos Diegues (Portuguese). Based on a true episode in Brazilian history, **Xica** is a stunning, multi-colored tapestry tracing the rise and fall of a provocative slave whose sensual nature drove men crazy. Power-hungry Xica blazes on the screen, fueled by an incredible performance by Zeze Mota in the title role.

**Oct. 11**

**GATES OF HEAVEN** — 1980 — 85 mins. — Errol Morris. A documentary concerning the relocation of the residents of a San Francisco pet cemetery. The often sad but usually hilarious interviews with the bereaved owners make this one of the most original films in recent memory.

**Oct. 18**

**WHO'LL STOP THE RAIN?** — 1978 — 126 mins. — Karel Reisz. From the director of **The French Lieutenant's Women**, an unfairly ignored film version of Robert Stone's award-winning novel **Dog Soldiers** about Vietnam and drug-dealing in southern California. Powerful performances by Nick Nolte, Tuesday Weld, and Michael Moriarty.

**Oct. 25**

**PEEPING TOM** — 1962 — 103 mins. — Michael Powell. Now recognized as a masterpiece of cinematic terror in the style of Hitchcock, this film concerns a cameraman at a British studio whose odd hobby is filming women as he is in the process of murdering them.

**Nov. 1**

**COCKTAIL MOLOTOV** — 1980 — 100 mins. — Diane Kurys (French). This

charming film follows the further adventures of Anne, the adolescent heroine of Kurys' first film **Peppermint Soda**. Now 18 and on the road between Venice and Paris, Anne and two male companions try to reach Paris before the May revolution ends without them.

**Nov. 8**

**DISTANT THUNDER** — 1973 — 100 mins. — Satyajit Ray (Indian). In a remote Indian village, the tranquillity of life is shattered as a rice shortage caused by World War II becomes increasingly acute. The scramble to survive humiliates some and ennobles others. An heroic, moving film by one of the great directors of our time.

**Nov. 15**

**I SENT A LETTER TO MY LOVE** — 1981 — 102 mins. — Moshe Mizrahi (French). From the director of **Madame Rosa**, this mature, tender film has won extravagant praise for Simone Signoret and Jean Rochefort as sister and brother in a tale about the magic of love. Co-stars Delphine Seyrig.

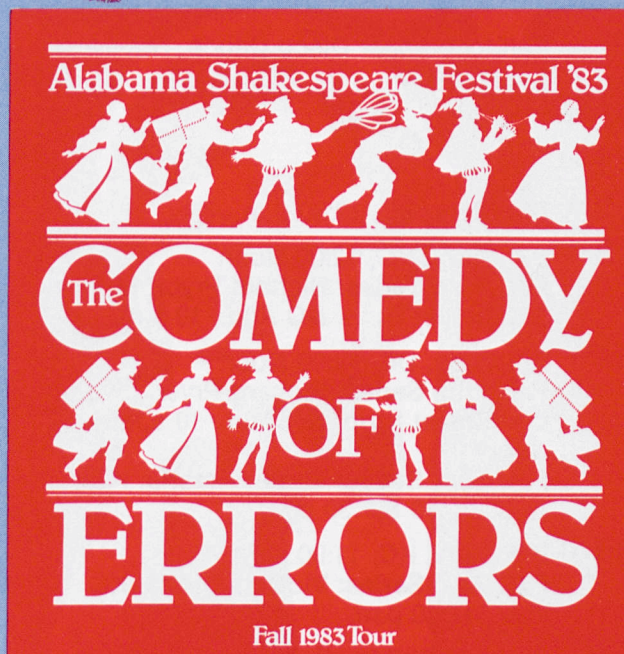

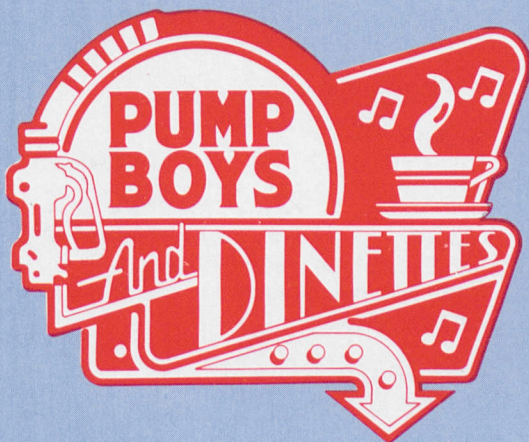

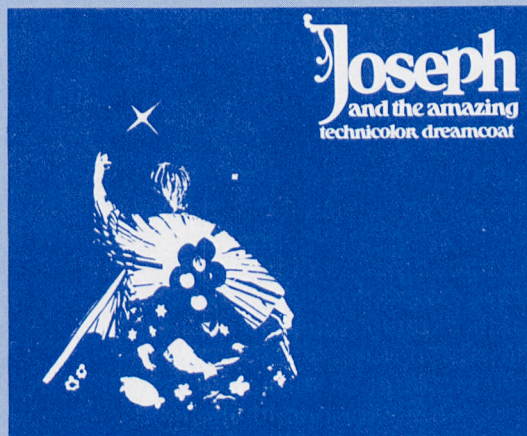
