

OCT 8: KAMILLA — 1983 —

Vibeke Lokkeberg (Norwegian). One of the first Norwegian films to gain international play. **Kamilla** is the touching story of a 7-year-old girl searching for understanding and love from her family and community in postwar Norway.

OCT 29: A SLAVE OF LOVE — 1978 —

Nikita Mikhalkov (Russian) — 94 mins. In 1918 after the Bolshevik Revolution has just taken place, a film crew is attempting to finish a romantic melodrama, oblivious to the tide of change about to engulf them. In the process the leading lady falls in love with a Bolshevik cameraman.

NOV 19: MALOU — 1983 — Jeanine Meerapfel

(German) — 95 mins. Winner of the International Film Critics's Prize at Cannes. **Malou** is the story of a young woman trying to save her crumbling marriage and discover her own identity, in the process becoming obsessed with uncovering her dead mother's mysterious past.

SEPT 24: SUGAR CANE ALLEY — 1983 —

Euzhan Palcy (French) — 103 mins. Visually stunning, full of hope and optimism, this is the story of a gifted boy growing up in rural Martinique in 1931 among simple, warm people who want him to realize his dream of becoming a writer.

OCT 15: PAULINE AT THE BEACH — 1983 —

Eric Rohmer (French) — 94 mins. From the wise and witty director of **Claire's Knee**, another incisive view of men and women talking about, planning to, and falling in love — while on summer vacation on the Normandy coast.

NOV 5: LA TRUITE — 1982 — Joseph Losey

(French) — 105 mins. Ravishing film about a cool temptress (Isabelle Huppert) who gets what she wants from men and then gets away from them. With Jeanne Moreau.

NOV 26: BLOOD WEDDING — 1982 —

Carlos Saura (Spanish) — 72 mins. From the director of **Carmen**, a masterful blending of drama, dance and film which first takes us backstage to watch the dancers and musicians as they arrive at the rehearsal of Lorca's classic, transmuted from straight drama to ballet.

OCT 1: LE BAL — 1982 —

Ettore Scola (Italian/French) — 112 mins. A highly original panorama of life, love, war and peace from the mid-30's to the 80's. Set in a ballroom with no dialogue, just music and sound effects, the actors play different roles in different time periods. Unique and most worthwhile.

OCT 22: PROVIDENCE — 1977 — Alain

Resnais (British) — 104 mins. A famous novelist (John Gielgud), suffering from a fatal illness, passes a terrible night hallucinating about various members of his family. With Ellen Burstyn, Dirk Bogarde, and David Warner.

NOV 12: TOUCH OF EVIL — 1985 —

Orson Welles — 93 mins. Narcotics agent Charlton Heston and wife Janet Leigh tangle w. corrupt cop Welles over murder in a seedy Mexican border town. With great cameos by Marlene Dietrich and Mercedes McCambridge.




