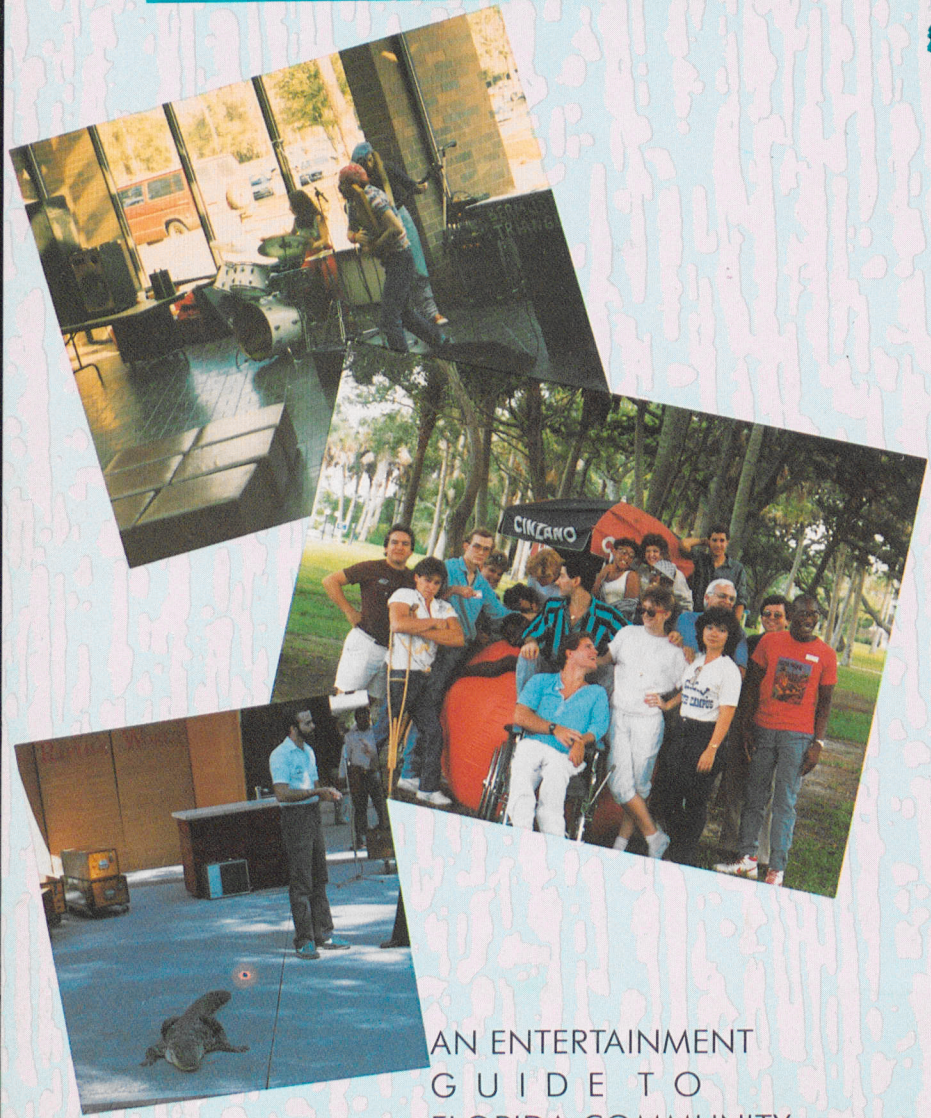

**EL AMOR BRUJO**  
 (Carlos Saura-1986-Spanish)  
 Saura combines breathtaking visuals & sensuous choreography to tell the story of gypsy lovers who use sorcery to banish the haunting presence of the woman's dead husband.

September 13  
**GOD'S COUNTRY**  
 (Louis Malle-1985-American)  
 Malle's last American film. An affectionate, revealing portrait of the heartland of post-Vietnam America as represented by the people of a small Minnesota farming community.

September 20  
**HOLLYWOOD SHUFFLE**  
 (Robert Townsend-1987-American)  
 Townsend plays a struggling young actor who works at a fast food restaurant while trying to break into the movies. The film follows him as he deals with obstacles & pressures that confront black actors today. A \$100,000 comedy that has much to say about being black & trying to make it.

September 27  
**THE SHOP ON MAIN STREET**  
 (Jan Kadar-1966-Czech)  
 Potent, poignant drama set in WW2 Czechoslovakia, where an old Jewish woman loses her small button shop, and depends on the man who takes it over to shield her from further persecution. Oscar-winning Best Foreign Film.

October 4  
**THE TREASURE OF THE SIERRA MADRE**  
 (John Huston-1948-American)  
 In this Oscar-winning film, Huston examines the effect of greed on three impoverished prospectors. Humphrey Bogart gives an outstanding performance of a likeable drifter who turns into a desperate man capable of killing his best friend.

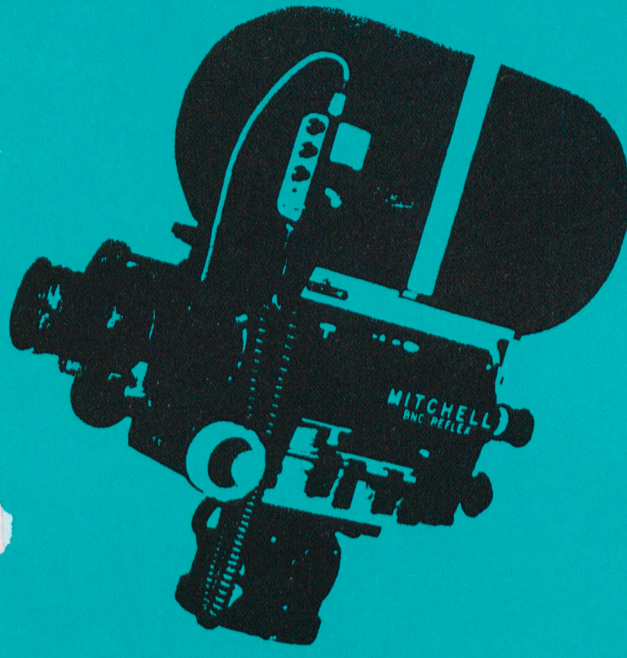
October 11  
**JEAN DE FLORETTE**  
 (Claude Berri-1987-French)  
 The educated, nature-loving hunchback Jean, his devoted wife Elizabeth and daughter Manon inherit a farm and fight their neighbors who are trying to take it away from them.

October 18  
**MANON OF THE SPRING**  
 (Claude Berri-1987-French)  
 The widely discussed conclusion of Marcel Pagnol's epic novel shot as one film but released as two. JEAN DE FLORETTE was the first part and this could be your only opportunity to see the two films in immediate succession.

October 25  
**A YEAR OF THE QUIET SUN**  
 (Krzysztof Znucci-1984-Polish)  
 Winner of the 1984 Golden Lion at the Venice Film Festival. An intensely human drama chronicling Poland's first severe winter after the defeat by Nazi Germany. In a ravaged post-war town, a forbidden love develops between an American sergeant & Polish woman who lost her husband in the war.

November 1  
**THE KILLING**  
 (Stanley Kubrick-1956-American)  
 Early Kubrick classic about elaborate racetrack robbery. Timothy Carey's cool killer, Elisha Cook's doomed marriage to Marie Windsor and "Dragnet" style narration are highlights.

November 8  
**WISH YOU WERE HERE**  
 (David Leland-1987-British)  
 The film is based on the early years of Cynthis Payne, who was the inspiration for the madam in PERSONAL SERVICES, a sequel coming soon.

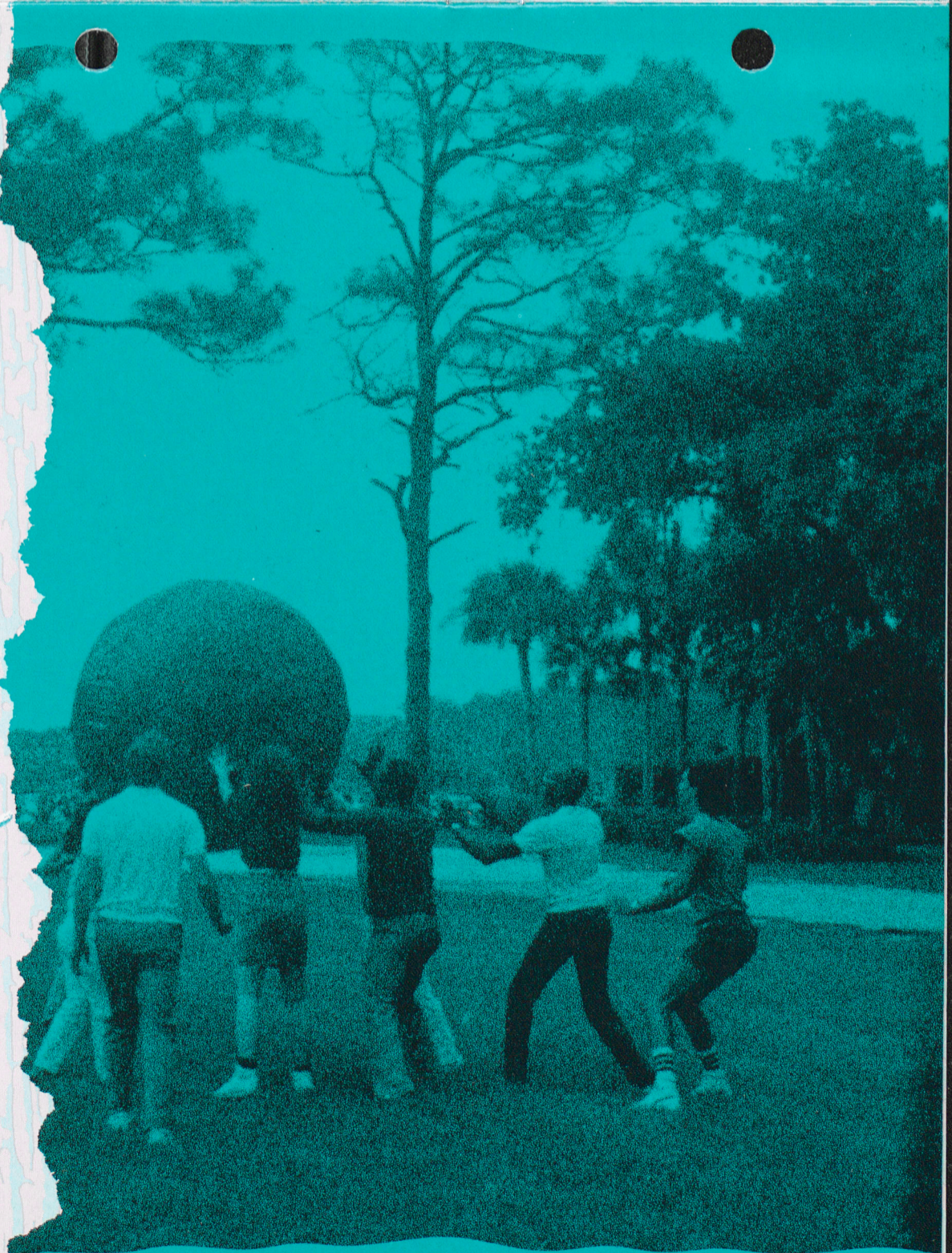
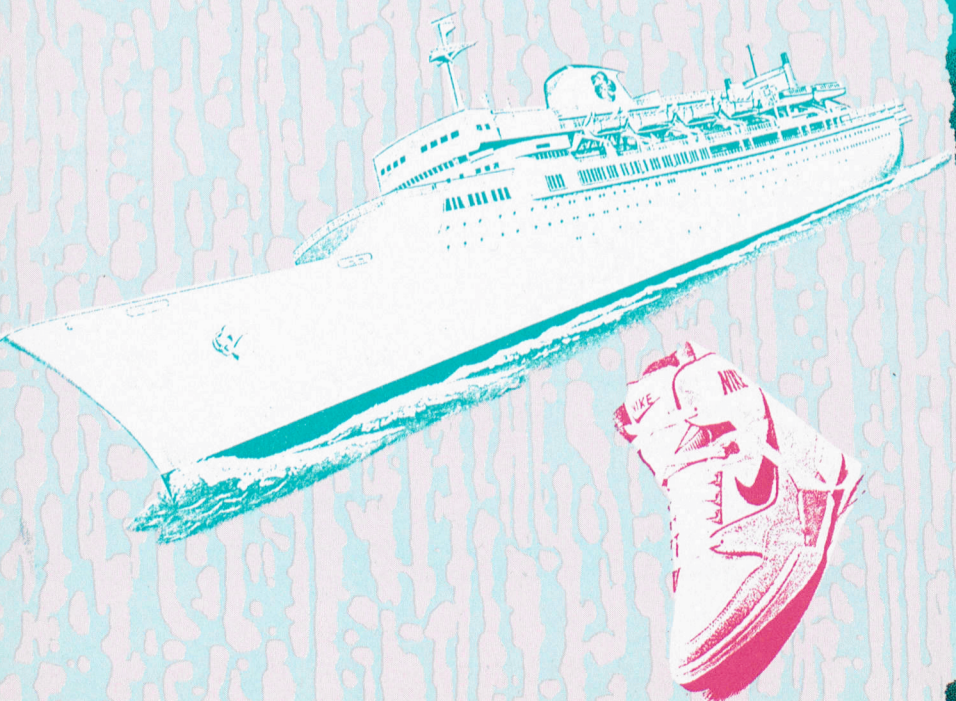
## WELLNESS

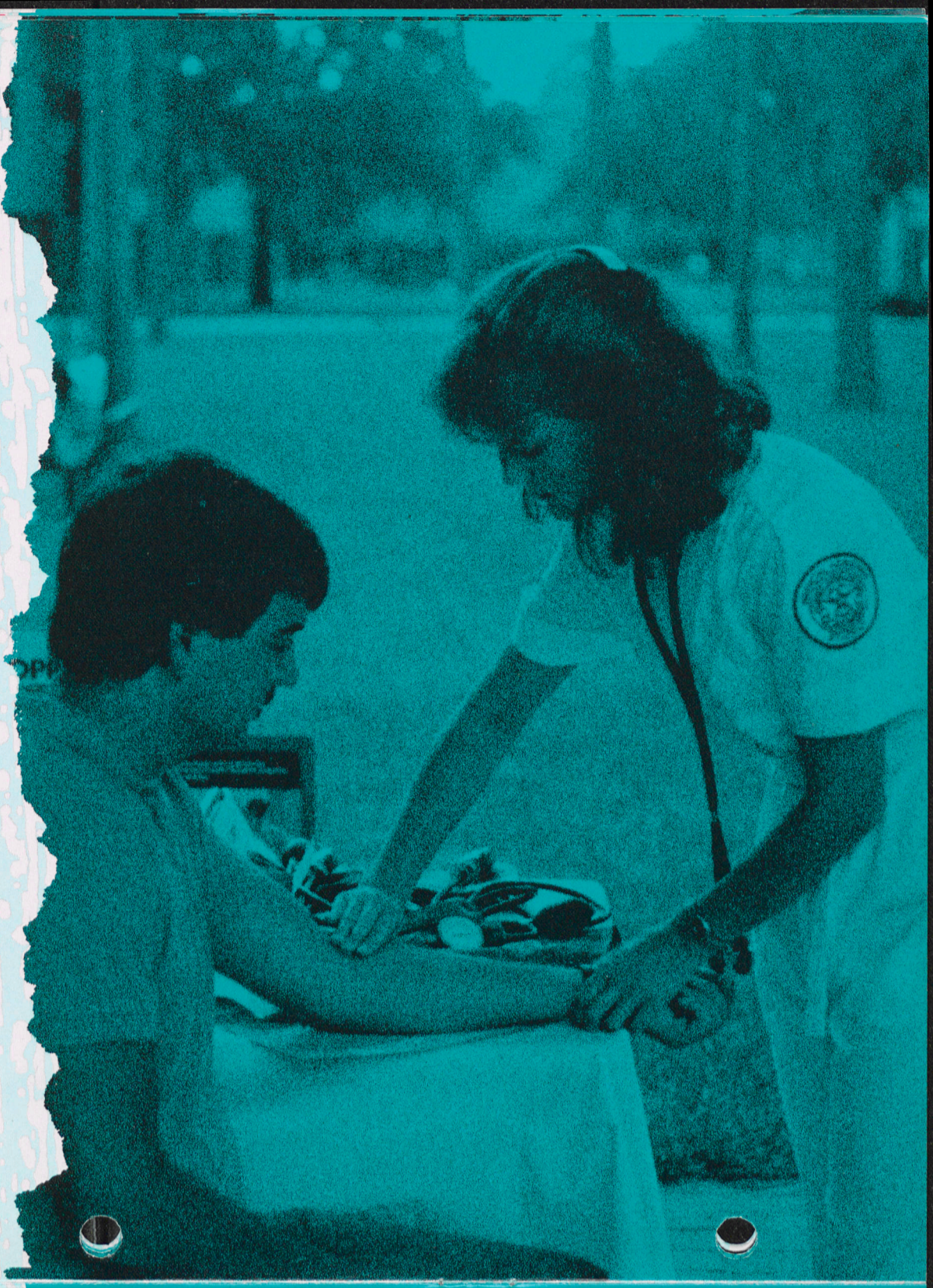
## PHI THETA KAPPA

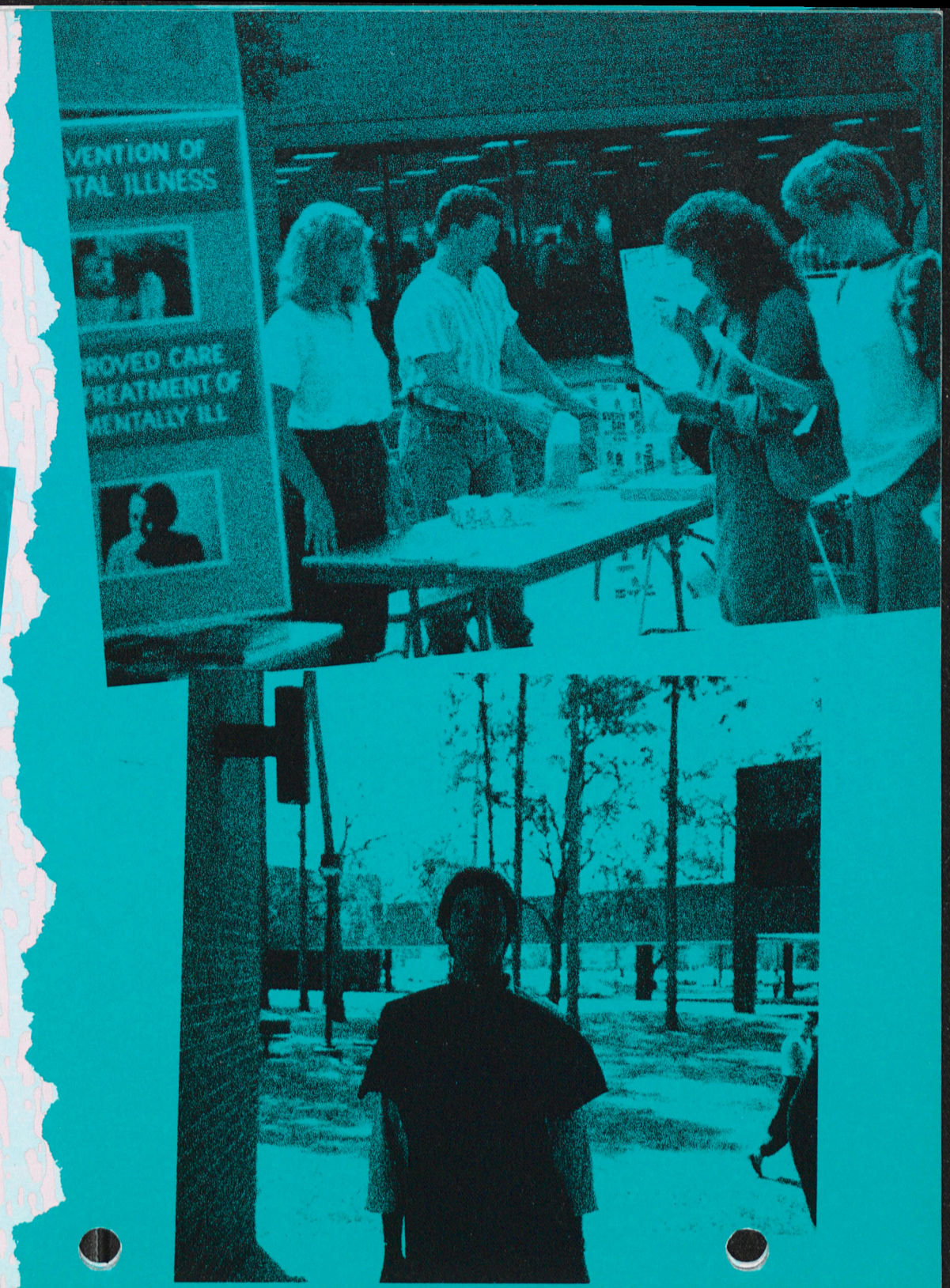
