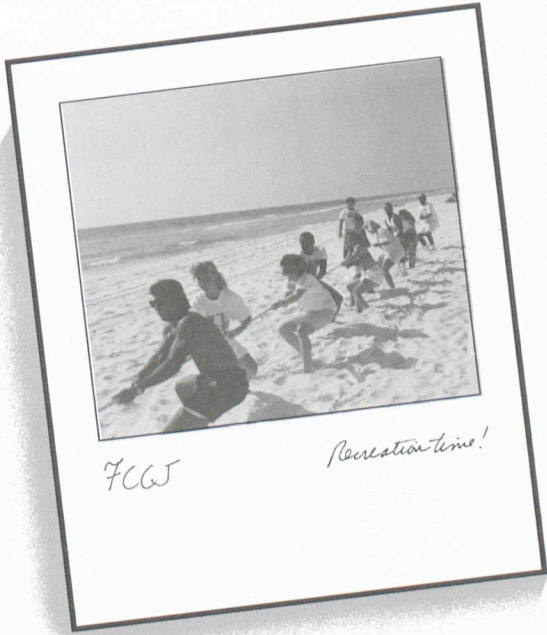
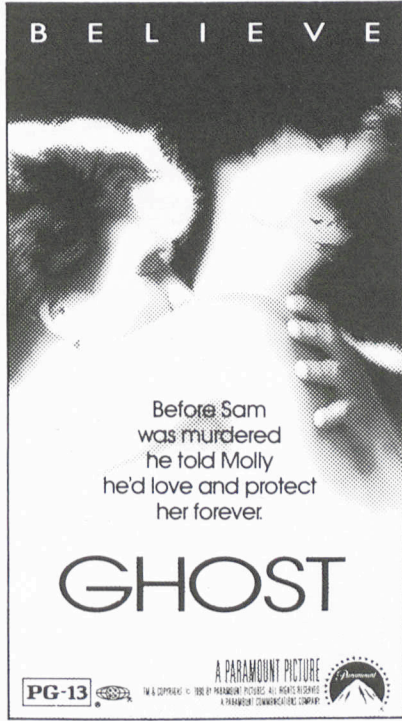
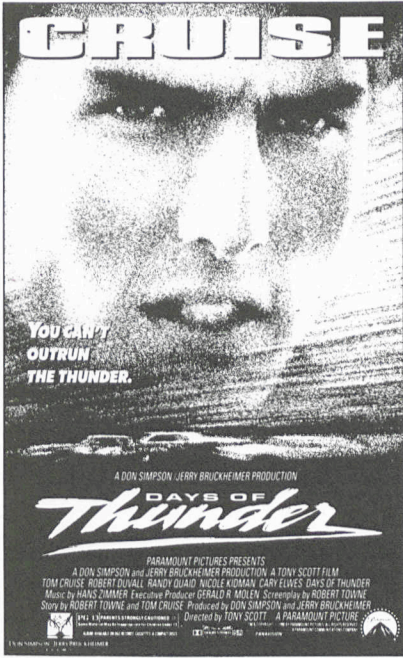
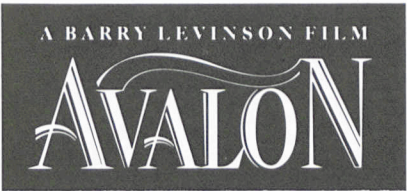
There are also collegewide recreation opportunities — called "extramurals" — that match campuses against each other. The nine events scheduled for the fall semester are:

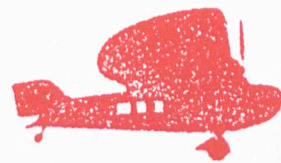
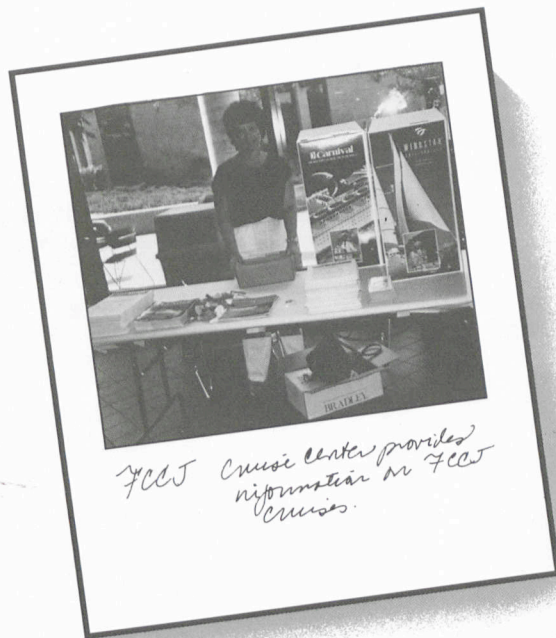

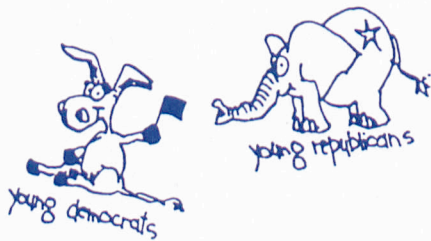
organizations and the faculty/staff advisers.

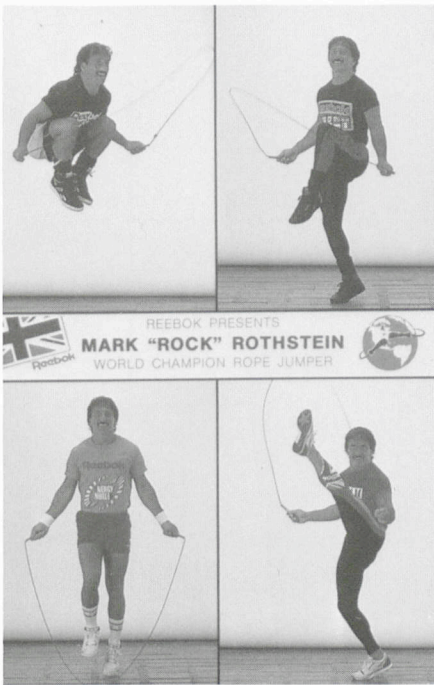

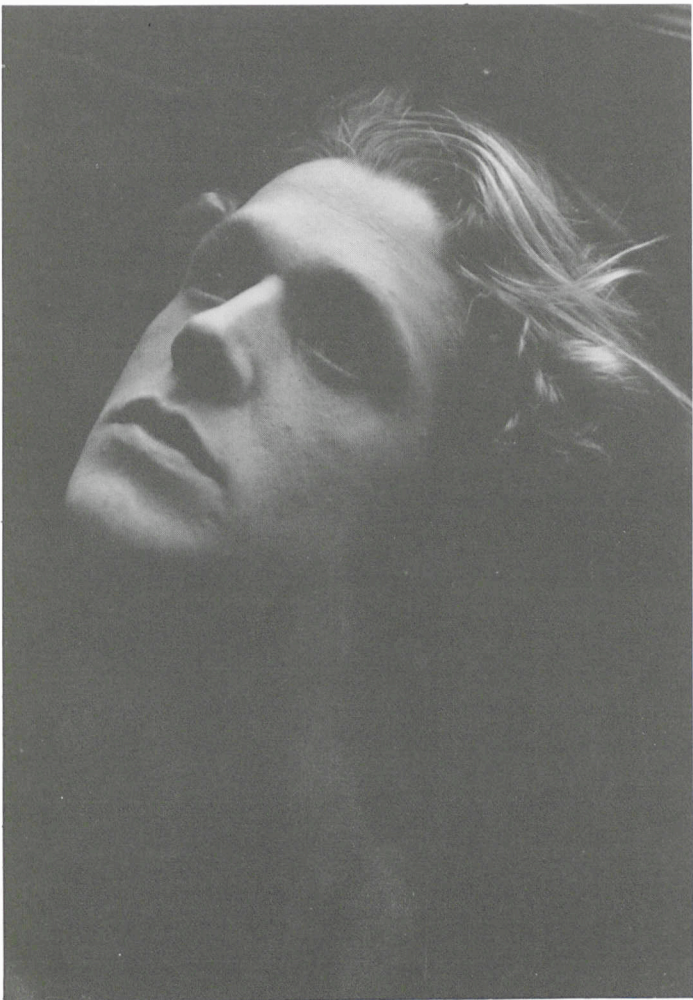

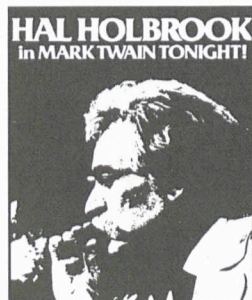
