



Meet new friends, pursue an interest or fulfill a dream by getting involved with a student organization. Here are some clubs currently in existence:






STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION


Eggroll...an unusual name, a unique sound




The Miss Florida Community College Scholarship Pageant is scheduled for February 16, 1991 at the Civic Auditorium, little theatre.
