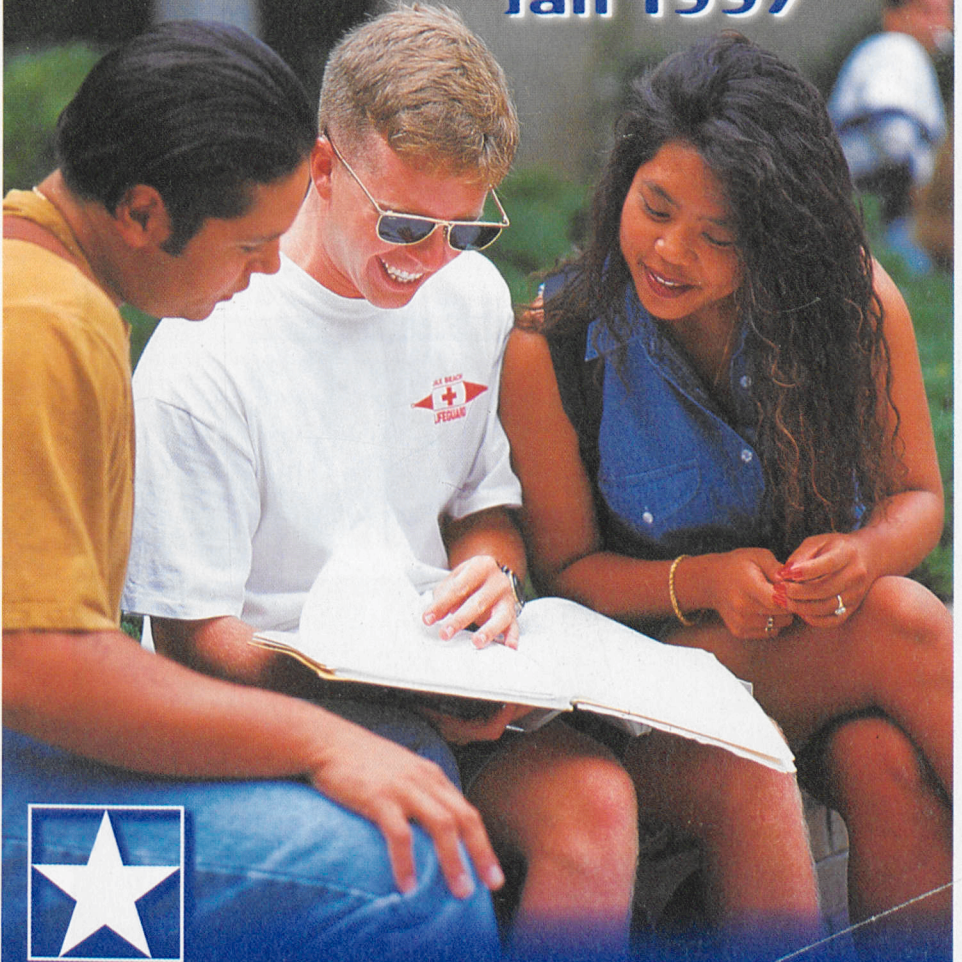

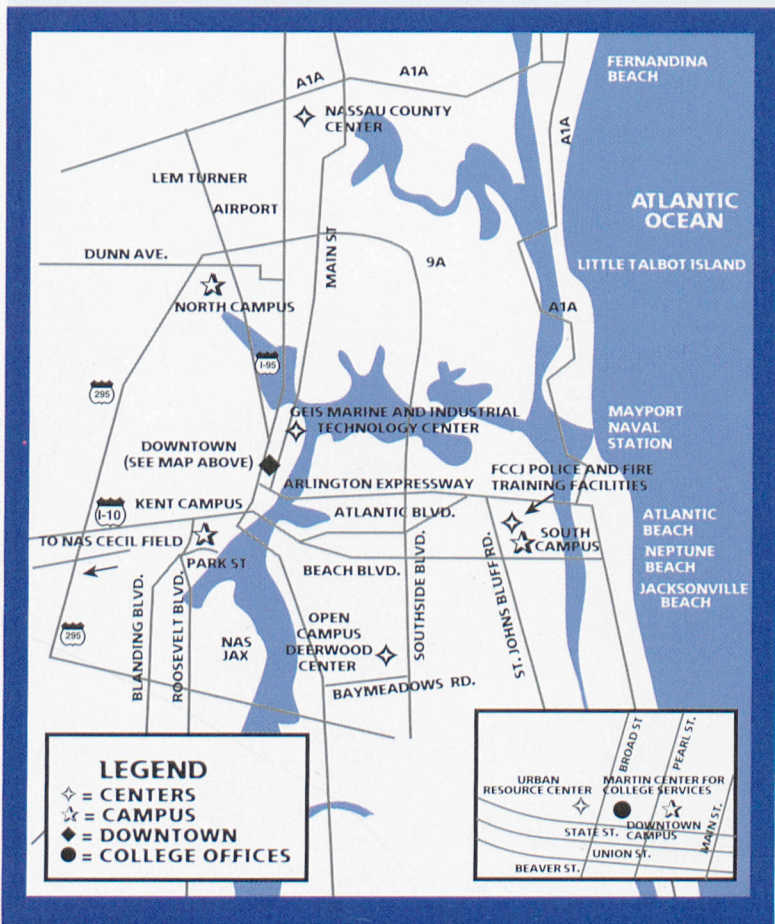

## STARCARD

## SEPTEMBER FEST II TO FEATURE COURTWRIGHT AND SLAUGHTER

The second annual September Fest for Writers will be Friday, Sept. 19 at FCCJ's North Campus. Two speakers from the University of North Florida historian David Courtwright and poet William Slaughter – will be featured.

Courtwright, chairman of UNF's history department, is the author of "Addicts Who Survived: An Oral History of Narcotic Use in America, 1923-65," "Dark Paradise: Opiate Addiction in America Before 1940," and "Violent Land: Single Men and Social Disorder From the Frontier to the Inner City."

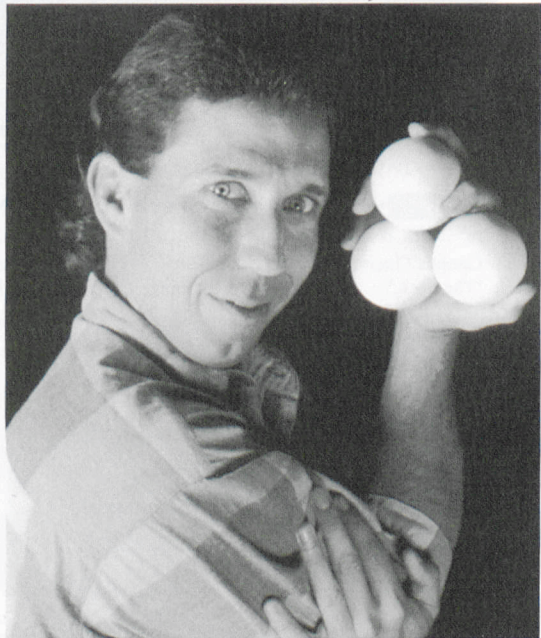
Slaughter is the author of "Untold Stories and Politics of My Heart," a collection of poems and pieces about his experience as a visiting professor/poet in China.

Other speakers include Virginia Wilson, author of "Sleep Thief," a book about restless leg syndrome; Marsha Dean Phelts, author of "An American Beach for African-Americans," (recently published by the University Press of Florida); Karen Rhodes, author of "Booking Hawaii Five-O;" poet Ann Sims author of "Family Secrets;" poet, short fiction author, novelist and small publisher Ruth Moon Kempfer; novelist and freelancer Lydia Filzen; and one or more editors of "The State Street Review."

The mini-conference will be sponsored by the FCCJ North Campus student activities office and the North Florida Writers Association. Admittance is free for FCCJ students, employees and active members of the NFW.

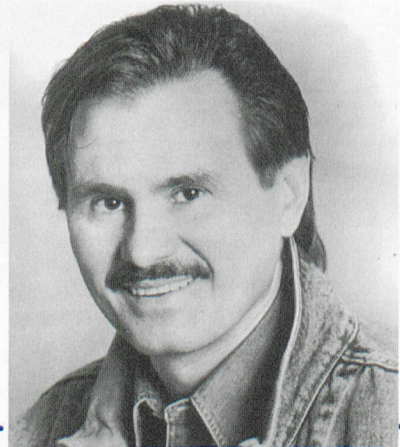

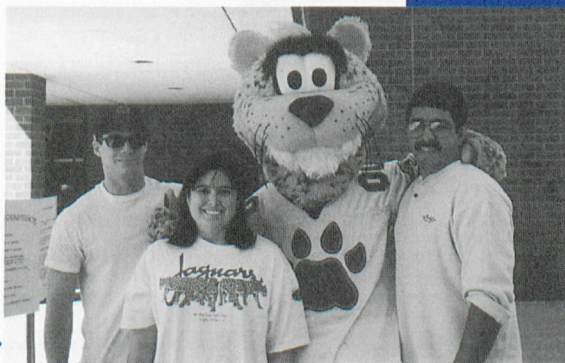
