## Trinidad Tripoli Steel Band

Warm up the new millennium with a little steel and reggae! From Port-of-Spain, Trinidad, to a world tour, this amazing group of performers plays a repertoire of music that ranges from classical to rock and roll...on oil drums. This feat has astounded audiences not only because of its oil drums, but also because of the unbelieveable fidelity and artistic accomplishments with which they render each concert or dance, whether it be modern, classical or their native
reggae Calypso. The Calypso numbers are in a class by
themselves, combined with exciting dancing and chanting as only the natives of Trinidad are capable of doing.

Born from the desperate days following World War II when it was not possible to get their instruments or money to play their Calypso music, the natives of Trinidad discovered that abandoned oil drums could be used for musical tunes. Thus began the original steel drum band, and now Trinidad Tripoli has played such pockets of sophistication as the Rockefeller Plaza, Central Park and Lincoln Center in New York City. Now's your chance to see them at FCCJ on January 18 th and 19 th.
