




the student center, you know immediately that you are the recipient of a gift.

Equally at home in concert halls and clubs, he has performed everywhere from Carnegie Hall to the Hollywood Bowl to Brazil's Teatro Guaira, and on national television and radio. Pulitzer Prize-winning composer John Adams recently wrote the electric violin concerto "The Dharma at Big Sur" specifically for Tracy, inspired by his unique 6-string electric violin. Tracy premiered the piece at the gala opening of the Los Angeles Philharmonic's new Walt Disney Concert Hall in 2003 and has since performed it at London's Royal Albert Hall and Avery Fisher Hall in Lincoln Center among others and has recorded it with the BBC Symphony. 


