

## FJC BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING HIGH-LITES

Dr. Benjamin R. Wygal was reappointed at the MARCH 14, 1979 BOARD MEETING as FJC's President for the fiscal year 1979-80, beginning July 1. The reappointment was by unanimous vote of the trustees. Dr. Wygal has been FJC's president since April, 1970. Other key reappointments by the Board: Dr. Charles O. Ferguson, Executive Vice-President; Dr. Ezekiel W. Bryant, Provost, North Campus; Dr. Oliver R. Finch, Provost, South Campus; Dr. Kermit C. Miller, Provost, Fred H. Kent Campus, and Dr. Edgar C. Napier, Provost, Downtown Campus. The Board also reappointed a large number of other administrators and faculty for 1979-80.

Caddell Construction Company of Jacksonville was awarded a \$1,368,000 contract as the low bidder meeting specifications for work at the Kent Campus which will include removal of the remaining World War II frame housing units which have served since the campus was acquired by the College in 1966. Other work under the contract includes installation of underground utilities and drainage and construction of drives, parking lots, new vehicle entry road with guardhouse, and bus shelter and exterior lighting, plus seal coating of asphalt surfaces of the drives and parking lots. Hopefully, the new buildings under construction at Kent will be fully operational by the next Fall Term, beginning August 22.

Enthusiastically received by the Board was a report by Dr. Roland Terrell on FJC's extensive International Education program. Among the many projects are faculty and student exchanges with foreign institutions and faculty summer studies abroad.

Sandy Peterson, who chairs the Career Employees Council, told the Board a Council committee is reviewing FJC employee evaluation forms, which she said need updating and revision. "But no matter how good a form you devise, our supervisors need to be trained in evaluation," she said, adding that the Council has received support from FJC's administration in its studies of evaluation forms as well as workmen's compensation.
