BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

A Report of the FJC District Board of Trustees Meeting

Dr. Wygal Reappointed As FJC President

Dr. Benjamin R. Wygal will begin his 14th year as President of Florida Junior College at Jacksonville as his reappointment was approved by the FJC Board of Trustees during their MARCH 21, 1984 MEETING. Dr. Wygal's reappointment was concurrent with the Board's decision to grant the 1984/85 annual contracts for instructional and noninstructional administrative and professional personnel. The Board also approved continuing contracts for 18 instructional staff.

Additionally, the Board accepted the resignations, for the purpose of retirement, from the following: Downtown Campus Plumbing and Pipefitting Professor Lawrence W. Barrett; South Campus Art Professor Thelma Brownett; Kent Campus English Professor Iris C. Hoop; North Campus Nursing Professor Edna Mae Jones; Kent Campus Dean of General Studies Robert M. Sanford; North Campus Adult Basic Education Professor Ernestine B. Cox; Kent Campus Biology Professor Charles L. Sheridan; and Security Officer Travis D. Ayers. The Trustees also accepted the resignation of Associate Vice President for College Relations and Development Dr. C. Roland Terrell for professional advancement.

1984/85 College Calendar Approved

The Board approved minor changes in the 1984/85 College Calendar to reschedule the Spring Break to correspond with the Easter Holiday (April 8 - 12, 1985); to reschedule two days for faculty convocations; and to accommodate the four-day workweek. (Please see back page for calendar.)

Endowment Funds Approval Granted

The Board approved the implementation by FJC of an endowment fund

for student financial aid. The fund will insure future College support to student financial aid programs which continue to be affected by fluctuations or limitations in external funding. The program will continue to be complemented by the FJC Foundation scholarship program which has been so successful.

Audit Report Overview Given

An overview of internal audits was given before the Board by the FJC Internal Auditor. The report detailed basic functions of the department and provided an overview of audits completed during a 15-month period of time. On going audits were also reviewed. The Trustees requested that a monthly update on audits be given as part of the Board's regular reports. Additionally, the Trustees requested they be immediately informed by the President of any audit irregularities.

Board Supports International Education

The Board unanimously supported FJC's efforts in the area of International Education and urged continued involvement in internationalizing curriculum for College students. A comprehensive report on the international education program will be presented at the April Board meeting.
