A Report of the FJC District Board of Trustees Meeting

Budget Workshop Slated

The Florida Junior College at Jacksonville District Board of Trustees will meet to discuss and review the proposed 1984-85 fiscal year budget and pay plan at a special workshop to be held July 18, 2 p.m. The announcement to meet came during the Trustees' JUNE 27, 1984 MEETING. The workshop is a non-voting meeting and the Board is expected to approve the pay plan and budget at its July 25 regular meeting.

The pay plan, as presented at the Board's June 20 meeting, calls for adoption of a standard 205-day contract for all full-time teaching faculty, but the College may offer 170-day and 220-day contracts. Salary increases for faculty will average 3.9 percent. Twelve month employees will see a change in their workyear schedule to a standard 250-day workyear. Career employees are expected to receive a 4.81 percent salary increase and administrative and professional staff receive an average 3.25 salary increase.

Tuition Increases Approved

While the Board approved increases in student fees and tuition in non-college credit vocational and non-Florida resident adult secondary courses, there were no tuition hikes in college credit and compensatory course fees.

Matriculation and tuition registration and financial aid fees for college credit and compensatory courses will remain at the 1983-84 level of \$18 per credit hour for Florida residents and \$38 per hour for non-residents.

Matriculation and tuition registration fees for non-college credit postsecondary adult vocational courses will increase \$2.47 per credit hour equivalent for a \$9.22 per credit equivalent hour cost for Florida residents and increase \$4.95 for an \$18.45 per credit equivalent hour cost for non-residents. Fees for non-college credit supplemental

vocational courses will increase \$7.88 per credit hour equivalent for a \$14.63 per credit hour equivalent cost for Florida residents and \$22.50 per credit hour equivalent for a \$29.25 per credit hour equivalent cost for non-residents.

Fees for non-college adult secondary courses will remain at \$4 per course for Florida residents and set at an \$8 cost per course for non-residents.

All course fees will go into effect with the 1984-85 academic year and were approved to comply with State Board of Education rules.
