On October 24, Eva Grayzel gave an informative presentation to an audience of nearly 200 at FSCJ North Campus on the importance of Oral Cancer Screenings. After the presentation, attendees were invited to the onsite Dental Hygiene Clinic for oral cancer screenings from FSCJ students under the supervision of our clinic dentists.

One American dies every hour from oral cancer.



Eva Grayzel came close to becoming a statistic. A nationally-recognized storyteller and performance

artist, she was diagnosed at age 33 with stage IV oral cancer and given a 15 percent chance of survival. After regaining her deep, vibrant voice, Eva applied her stage skills to communicate the depth of her experience in a unique and powerful way.

For over a decade, she has captivated dental professionals worldwide using her story as a catalyst for change. The riveting details of her delayed diagnosis stimulate thinking about enhanced patient care and education. Audiences don't just hear her story, they experience it.

A champion for early detection, Eva founded the Six-Step Screening™ oral cancer awareness campaign.

FSCJ was pleased to accept a \$250,000 check to support a student scholarship endowment that was established in 2011.

THE PLAYERS Championship established their \$1 million Red Scholarship Endowment in honor of the late Mr. Donald Zell. In addition to



his commitment to the Red Coats, Mr. Zell played several instrumental roles within FSCJ. He served as president of the FCCJ Foundation in the 80s and was later appointed as the Board Chairman of FCCJ in 1990. Prior to that, he was also the co-owner of the North End Company, the largest donor of land to our North Campus.

THE PLAYERS Championship announced the 2017 tournament generated \$8.7 million for local charities, surpassing last year's record total of \$8.5 million.

## FSCJ BlueWave Volleyball Team Wins Conference Championship



FSCJ's BlueWave Volleyball team clinched first place in the Panhandle Conference with a 3-1 (17-25, 25-15, 25-19, and 25-18) win over Santa Fe State College.

This is the first conference championship win for the team since 2010. The first-place win gave the BlueWave the automatic bid to the

Florida College System Activities Association (FCSAA/Region 8) Tournament to be held November 3-5, 2017, in Bradenton, Florida. The last appearance at the FCSAA/Region 8 for the BlueWave was in 2013.

This year's team is led by Interim Head Coach Jordan Yantin with an overall 16-7 record and 7-1 conference record. Nicolette Ramos and Kaylon Cruickshank led the BlueWave against Santa Fe State College with 12 kills each during the match. Cheryke Brian-Garmos led the BlueWave with 51 assists along with nine kills and eight digs.

#### Players Also Honored for Achievements On and Off the Court

Five FSCJ BlueWave Volleyball student-athletes have been recognized for academic achievement and awarded National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) honors on the First and Second All-Academic Teams.
