Beautifully renovated to maintain the building's historical character, the 58 apartment-style living spaces are positioned on the second through sixth floors. Residents enjoy access to FSCJ's Downtown Campus, dining and entertainment just steps from their front door. Convocation 2018 Recap



FSCJ's 2018 Convocation was held August 30 at the South Campus Gymnasium to kick off the new academic year.

Interim FSCJ President Kevin Hyde provided updates on where the College is in regards to the priorities he shared on his first day at FSCJ. You can find the highlights of his remarks in the Collegewide email he sent on Friday, August 31. See below.

Good morning! I hope that you were able to join us yesterday for Convocation 2018. It was a great morning of information sharing and camaraderie to gear up for the beginning of the new

academic year.

In the event you were unable to participate, either in person or via the livestream, I've included a brief recap below. Special thanks to those of you who were working throughout Student Services, Advising Centers and Business Offices to help our students register and enroll, which is critically important work. I know there were several other offices that were officially open during Convocation, so I appreciate your dedicated service as well.

• As an update on where we are with the priorities I shared in my first day email, I appreciate all

- those who've made the ERP improvements their number one priority. I know it's still not perfect but think we can all agree we are in a better spot now than we were this time last year.
- Similarly, the Financial Aid team has made great improvements to their processes and services.
- We had a lot of early growth in enrollment this term, however, while we still see a lot of enrollments coming in each day leading up to the start of classes, we have had several drops for non-payment. As of today, we are at 104 percent of final college credit enrollment for the fall term last year. I am confident that we will continue to see an increase in enrollment as we enter the B and C sessions this term.
- We have done a lot of work to bring FSCJ back into the community's spotlight as a vital workforce partner. I've been meeting with leaders in a variety of different industries to gather their perceptions of the College and to discuss how we can build and strengthen our partnerships to mutually benefit their business, this institution and, most importantly, our students.
- As you are well aware, we just came through an incredibly tough budget year. We were forced to make some difficult decisions, but we are in a better place now to serve our students more efficiently and effectively.
- We've been very intentional about working toward improving morale. At a very basic level, communication channels have been opened for you to share your opinions and ideas. Please continue to submit your thoughts through the suggestion boxes, emails, phone calls and even stopping by my office. Many of your suggestions have already led to new and exciting outcomes that are being implemented. For a list of the suggestions and responses, visit the SharePoint site.
 - This academic year, we'll place a greater emphasis on philanthropic opportunities because we are the community's college, after all. We're developing a structured volunteer program to nurture your generosity and will share more details on that soon. We'll once again participate in Giving Tuesday to serve our community. Mark your calendar for that event on November 27, 2018.
 - Based on some comments I've received as I visited with different groups and individuals across the College, many people mentioned they felt that the sense of community at each of our campuses and centers had been lost. Like you, I think it's important to build connections with those that we surround ourselves with on a daily basis, so, to address the concern, we've developed a plan to begin rebuilding community at each location.
 - We are instituting Campus Liaisons who will serve as a bridge between Cabinet and me, as well as host campus-based leadership meetings. The Campus Liaisons are Dr. John Wall for South Campus, Ms. Jana Kooi at Deerwood Center, Dr. Ian Neuhard for Kent Campus and Cecil Center, Dr. Cedrick Gibson for North Campus and Nassau Center, and Dr. Marie Gnage for Downtown Campus. This is an additional role for each of these individuals, and not a change in their current position, title or job description.
 - A Campus Ambassador for each location will serve as a point of contact for faculty at their specific campus, will lead campus-based faculty meetings and collaborate with Human Resources in faculty onboarding. The Campus Ambassadors are Ms. Talani Torres for South Campus, Dr. Robert Greene for Deerwood Center, Dr. Jeff Hess for Kent

- Campus, Dr. Neal Henning for North Campus and Dr. Tiffany Hunter for Downtown Campus.
- Additionally, Events Committees are being established at each campus and center that will be made up of representatives from all employee groups who will come together to plan events and activities at their locations. They will also support the Collegewide Events Committee, made up of the chairs of the Campus Events Committees, to execute Collegewide events. The Events Committee Chairs are Brenda Mills for Downtown Campus, Sandi Seibel for North Campus, Shelly Hammack for South Campus, Susan Haley for Kent Campus, Jace Christovich for Deerwood Center, Donna Martin for Nassau Center and Sharon Hobbs for Cecil Center.
- FSCJ placed in the silver category for Performance-Based Funding once again, which is great news. What it means, though, is that there is room for improvement. We are going for gold and we need you to help us get there. We can achieve gold together by consistently doing our individual jobs to the best of our ability and supporting each other along the way.
- We encourage each of you to take advantage of opportunities that allow us to share the incredible work you do on a daily basis with our peers and the general public. There are many awards and honors that you may pursue. Without a doubt, you're already doing the work worthy of such honors and I think you deserve much praise for it. This year, we will seek out these opportunities for recognition, go after them, and when we win, we will celebrate along with you!
 - There are numerous awards programs through the Association of Florida Colleges (AFC), the American Association of Community Colleges (AACC), the National Institute for Staff and Organizational Development (NISOD), and the Association of Community College Trustees (ACCT), to name a few.

Last but not least, on Fridays, I want to empower you to wear jeans whenever possible. There are many who've already embraced casual Fridays, but I know there's some hesitation from others. I'm going to wear jeans on Fridays when I can, and I urge you to do the same.

Throughout the month of September, FSCJ is honoring National Campus Safety Awareness Month by encouraging all students, faculty and staff to download the FSCJ Safe mobile app. The app has many helpful features designed to keep you safe. The Mobile BlueLight will dial Campus Security and send them your location in the event of an emergency. Another important feature is the Virtual Walkhome that allows FSCJ Campus Security to monitor as you are walking on campus and, at any point during your walk, you can select "Emergency" which will dial 911. Take some time to download the app from the App Store or on Google Play.

One other useful resource is FSCJ's Emergency Notification System. If you are signed up for the alert system, you will receive a text message in the event of an emergency. All faculty, staff and students are strongly encouraged to register their cellphone numbers for FSCJ Emergency Text Alerts at fscj.edu/discover/public-safety-security/emergency-information. FSCJ Awards First Generation Scholarship in Conjunction with Florida Prepaid College Foundation

FSCJ awarded its first-ever First Generation Scholarship to Daisha Bullard, a recent graduate of Englewood High School. The two-year scholarship was established from a 1:1 match opportunity provided by the Florida Prepaid College Foundation.

As a result of the scholarship, Daisha will become the first in her family to attend college. She was selected for the award based on the nominations she received from FSCJ Student Recruitment representatives who were impressed by her discipline, respectfulness and confidence.

"This scholarship has allowed me to be able to start college without the worry of where the money would come from for my classes or books," said Ms. Bullard. "It's given me the opportunity to get a jump start on my education without starting in debt."

Beginning this Fall Term, Daisha will pursue her Associate in Arts degree at FSCJ. Upon completion, her goal is to transfer to Florida A&M University where she hopes to study to become a nurse.

Aligned with their mission to support higher education and at-risk students, the Florida Prepaid College Foundation announced in February that the Challenge Match Scholarship program would contribute half of the cost for one two- or four-year Florida Prepaid College Plan for first-in-family incoming freshmen of state universities and colleges in Florida. The remaining funds are to be

supplied by the institution.

"FSCJ is proud to have the ability to support Ms. Bullard's educational goals through the First Generation Scholarship," said FSCJ Interim President Kevin Hyde. "There are many worthy students who have the desire to attend college but simply do not have the means. The Florida Prepaid College Foundation continues to be an invaluable educational partner and resource for families in our state."


Faculty and Staff Achievements
