FSCJ Receives U.S. Department of Education Grant for Affordable Child Care

FSCJ was recently awarded the Child Care Access Means Parents in School (CCAMPIS) grant from the United States Department of Education (USDOE). This four-year grant, titled FSCJ CCAMPIS-Urban Core, will provide child care scholarship funds to low-income FSCJ students who are parents.

Over the grant period, FSCJ is projected to receive the total award potential of \$460,556 for child care services. Aside from the financial support it will offer, the program will also provide students and their children with enriching, high-quality learning and developmental experiences in a safe, reputable child care facility.

Utilizing FSCJ's existing infrastructure and resources in conjunction with child care scholarships, the services will be provided at the existing on-campus child care center located at FSCJ's Downtown Campus, the Chappell School.

The project will serve 50 full- and part-time students annually with a total of 70 students who will be served over the four-year project period. The program will allow the student parents to focus on their education, and their child's well-being, without the financial and emotional impact associated with finding quality child care. For this reason, the project anticipates an 80 percent retention rate and an 80 percent graduation/transfer rate of participants.

Additionally, supplemental support services will be provided for CCAMPIS participants including parenting workshops, case management support and a standing annual meeting with the Dean of Education in order to track their progress.

Participating parents will provide co-payments for child care based on a sliding scale which includes family size and income after allowable and verified deductions, such as medical premiums. The payment amounts will be based on the state of Florida's most recent state median income guidelines.

"We are excited for this CCAMPIS grant because we know it will be an invaluable benefit for many of our students and their children. By removing the stress associated with finding, and paying for, a place to entrust with their child's care while they are pursuing postsecondary education, these students will be better positioned to achieve their educational goals," said FSCJ Interim President Kevin E. Hyde. "This is just one more example of how FSCJ is finding ways to educate our community no matter what limitations or barriers to education one might have."

Applications for the CCAMPIS scholarship will be accepted beginning October 1, 2018, for the Spring 2019 Term. Applications will be accepted on an ongoing basis into the first months of the term.

Eligibility requirements include: 1) applicant must be a United States citizen, national, refugee alien or permanent resident alien at the time of application; 2) demonstrated financial need as defined by the U.S. Department of Education rules for Financial Aid; 3) enrolled full- or part-time in the College's associate degree or technical certificate programs in the current or upcoming term; and 4) demonstrated academic potential as evidenced by a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 in college coursework or high school coursework.

To apply, students should visit fscj.edu/scholarships and complete the sign up form. After signing up on the site, interested applicants should select the Spring Childcare Grant Application for completion. Applicants must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) in addition to providing a recent grade report. 
Colleges to meet the growing need for skilled nurses and allied health professionals who serve the population of Florida.

Dr. Jerry Santiago Receives National Recognition



Professor and Histotechnology Program Director Dr. Jerry Santiago was recently named the Histotechnologist of the Year by the National Society for Histotechnology (NSH). This award is given annually to an individual who best exemplifies the qualities of dedication, service and involvement. He will be recognized at the annual NSH Award Banquet.

The NSH is a professional organization for individuals actively engaged in the histology field. Since its founding over 40 years ago, NSH's member community has grown to include over 3,000 histology professionals from around the world.

Last year, Dr. Santiago received the Peggy Wenk Histology Program Scholarship from the NSH. The \$5,000 award was provided for materials, meetings and speaker opportunities to support the histology program.

Engaging Students Outside the Classroom



On September 20, Deerwood Center hosted the kickoff event for the StrengthsFinder Learning Community sponsored by Professor of Mathematics Paula Risko and Professor of English and Student Life Skills Rawlslyn Francis. Associate Vice President of Student Success Dr. Erin Richman, a trained Clifton Coach, was invited to speak to students about their strengths.

Known as the father of strength-based psychology, Donald O. Clifton invented the Clifton StrengthsFinder to start a conversation about what is right with people by focusing on their strengths. He established 34 talent themes and used an assessment to measure them.

Professor Risko and Professor Francis were introduced to this idea when Dr. Richman held a Faculty Interest Group several years ago. Over the summer, the two decided to try the Clifton method with FSCJ students.

Prior to the workshop, students were asked to take the Clifton StrengthsFinder and bring their results with them. Dr. Richman spoke about how our students should use their natural talents and focus on their top five strengths, not their weaknesses, because it is more effective to improve strengths. She spoke about how to use these on resumes and during job interviews and pointed out that people who have the opportunity to focus on their strengths every day are six times as likely to be engaged in their jobs and more than three times as likely to report having an excellent quality of life.

Dr. Richman also talked about the importance of surrounding ourselves with a supportive network of people and focusing on the positive interactions those networks provide. The students were engaged and excited about their discoveries and look forward to continuing the conversation.

Professor Risko said, "This event enriches our students' lives by helping them grow as lifelong learners, which is at the heart of our mission here at the College. Ultimately, this will also improve the Jacksonville community at large. Professor Francis and I want to give a big thank you to everyone who participated and helped make this event a success."

Program Spotlight

TRiO Talent Search

TRiO Talent Search is a federally-funded program that offers specialized services and outreach for students who come from a low-income background and/or are first-generation college students. The TRiO program at FSCJ through Downtown and South campuses is offered at multiple middle and high schools around Jacksonville. At FSCJ South Campus alone, TRiO served 501 students during the 2017-18 school year. Out of 96 seniors, 79 graduated and of those graduates, 75 enrolled in a higher education program. Out of 405 non-senior participants, 388 continued in school at the next grade level for the 2018-19 school year.

What makes the TRiO Talent Search so unique? The answer is that even though it's dedicated to higher education, it also offers academic services, mentorship and financial counseling that students can start as early as sixth grade.

When asked why it is vital to start thinking about college in middle school, Wanda Martin, program director for TRiO at South Campus said, "Today's competitive college admissions process is proof that middle school is the right time to plant that seed of going to college. Middle school students may seem young, but they have arrived at the age where they're beginning to understand their strengths, interests and the kind of future they would like. Given this, it's certainly not too early to start promoting college awareness."

According to Dr. Sabrina F. Edwards, program director for TRiO at Downtown Campus, the best part of her job is being able to lead and inspire, and being able to make a difference in the lives of all the students she meets. As the product of a low-income family and a first-generation college student, she too understands how important it is to have programs like TRiO.

"I have students that I've helped who now have successful careers and are coming back and telling their success stories of how student support services changed their lives and how I was able to provide them with those resources."

The goal of TRiO is to not only speak with students about their goals and life aspirations but to also give them the knowledge and tools they need to get into college so they can go after their dreams. TRiO has had many success stories over the years or as said by Martin, "I feel any TRiO student that completes college is a success story."

FSCJ BlueWave Softball Hosts FSU




