


College and COVID-19: Teaching and Learning Through Crisis

On Thursday, August 20, FSCJ and Jacksonville Transportation Authority (JTA) held a signing event at Cecil Center to announce the expansion of JTA's autonomous vehicle program through new testing and educational initiatives on FSCJ campuses. The agreement will allow the expansion of the Ultimate Urban Circulator (U2C) Test & Learn Program to FSCJ's Commercial Driver's License Test Track on the Cecil Center Campus; the development of autonomous vehicle deployment on an FSCJ campus; and the development of curriculum, technology and educational initiatives relative to autonomous vehicles.

- The District Board of Trustees approved the posthumous awarding of the Honorary Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration to Mr. James H. Winston and the naming of the FSCJ Foundation conference room in his honor.
- The District Board of Trustees approved the posthumous awarding of the Honorary Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration to Mr. Donald D. Zell.
- The District Board of Trustees approved the continuation of insurance benefit premiums for the period of January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021.
- The District Board of Trustees approved the Florida College System Affordability Report for submission to the Florida Department of Education.
- The District Board of Trustees approved the College's intent to pursue two applications in support of our students with intellectual disabilities: 1) to apply to become a Florida Post-Secondary Comprehensive Transition Program and 2) to apply for federal status as a Comprehensive Transition Program.

Benefits Open Enrollment Begins Soon



The Open Enrollment period gives employees an opportunity to review benefit plan options and make changes for the next plan year. Open Enrollment for the 2021 plan year will be held October 19, 2020 through October 30, 2020. Due to the pandemic, all help sessions will be 100% online. Details about Open Enrollment, including dates and times of virtual help sessions, will be sent in the coming weeks.

Unfortunately, flu shots will not be available on campus this year. Employees covered by one of the College's medical plans are encouraged to get their flu shot directly from any provider in the network (members age 6 months and older) or at a pharmacy such as Walgreens, Publix or Winn Dixie (members age 18 and older). All Florida Blue health plans offered by the College cover the cost of the flu vaccine, so plan members pay \$0 for the shot. Please be sure to provide a health plan ID card at the time of service.
