#### **FSCJ** to Compete for the Aspen Prize

The Aspen Institute recently named FSCJ one of the 150 institutions eligible to compete for the \$1 million Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence, the nation's signature recognition of high achievement and performance among America's community colleges. The colleges selected for this honor stand out among more than 1,000 community colleges nationwide as having high and improving levels of student success as well as equitable outcomes for Black and Hispanic students and those from lower-income backgrounds.

The 150 eligible colleges have been invited to submit data and narratives as the next steps in an intensive data and practice review process, culminating in the announcement of the prize winner in spring 2023.

## U.S. Department of Education Grant Helps Establish Educational Opportunity Center

FSCJ recently received a five-year, \$1,160,250 grant from the U.S. Department of Education to establish a TRiO Educational Opportunity Center (EOC) to support adults from Duval and Nassau counties, specifically those who belong to traditionally underrepresented populations, have limited English proficiency or are living with disabilities. Focus will also be given to homeless children/youths, students who are in foster care/aging out of the foster care system, other disconnected students, and veterans, military spouses and their dependents.

The EOC will identify and serve 850 eligible participants yearly, eliminating the barriers to postsecondary education. A team of dedicated EOC Enrollment Coaches will also assist and connect participants to the following:

- Guidance on secondary school reentry or entry to a general educational development (GED®)/alternative program
- Individualized career and academic counseling
- · Tutoring services
- · Career workshops/counseling
- Veteran workshops on benefits, military spouse education, etc.
- Education and counseling designed to improve financial and economic literacy
- Mentoring services
- Support with college admission and financial aid applications
- Preparations for college entrance exams

#### **BlueWave Athletics Updates**

For the second time this season, Men's Cross Country freshman Brennan Popik took over the #1 spot and led Adrian Figueroa, John Bear, Drew Stone and Lucas VanGinkel to an 8th place finish at Embry-Riddle University. Brennan and Adrian moved to 5th and 7th on the BlueWave All-Time Top 10 list with their performance. The Women's Cross Country Team Captain Hannah Ziegler led the women with an 8th place finish on the course famous for being the most challenging in the state. Hailey Smith, Meghan Bonser and Faith Harrold had a best kick of the meet as well. "No one runs a PR on this course; it's too hard. We had three women PR on this course today - absolutely awesome," said Coach Jody Hale.

The FSCJ Women's basketball team welcomes back Diana Couch as the head coach for the 2021-22 season. Although this is a new role for Coach Couch, she is no stranger to FSCJ, having served as the associate director of athletics from 2018-20. "I am extremely grateful to the selection committee and the FSCJ administration for their confidence in me to lead the women's basketball program," said Coach Couch. "Our goal is to put a solid competitive team on the floor, achieve national academic recognition and gain the respect of our community through service. #### **Board Highlights**

- The District Board of Trustees authorized College administration to negotiate and enter into an indefinite quantity contract with Follett Higher Education Group as the top-ranked proposer to provide bookstore management services for the initial term of January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2027, with the option to extend the contract for up to two additional two-year terms.
- The District Board of Trustees approved the revised 2021-22 Career Salary Index as part of the Pay Plan.
- The District Board of Trustees approved the proposed Strategic Plan 2021-24 (Visionary Impact Plan 2.0) and revised Mission, Vision and Values.
- The District Board of Trustees approved a one-time lump sum payment to all qualifying non-instructional full-time and regular part-time employees effective with the processing of the December 22, 2021 payroll.
- The District Board of Trustees approved the FSCJ ACCESS Program to be effective Spring Term 2021-22 pursuant to Board Rule 6Hx7-4.19.
- The District Board of Trustees approved the inactivation of the Radiation Therapy Specialist Technical Certificate program embedded within the Associate in Science degree program in Radiation Therapy, effective at the end of the Fall Term 2021.
- The District Board of Trustees approved the inactivation of the Radiation Therapy Specialist Advanced Technical Certificate program embedded within the Associate in Science degree program in Radiation Therapy, effective at the end of the Spring Term 2022.
- The District Board of Trustees approved a new Financial Technology (FinTech)
  Advanced Technical Certificate program embedded within the Bachelor of
  Science degree program in Information Systems Technology, effective Fall Term
  2022.


